CHAPTER 92

(Senate Bill 99)

AN ACT concerning

State Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners - Educational Requirements

FOR the purpose of clarifying the educational requirements for an applicant to take the licensing examination of the Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners; and clarifying certain postgraduate program requirements.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Health Occupations

Section 16-302(d) and (f)

Annotated Code of Maryland

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health Occupations

16-302.

- (d) The applicant shall[:
- (1) Have completed at least 2 years of instruction in a college of liberal arts or sciences; and
- (2) Be] BE a graduate of a school or college of podiatry [or chiropody] that is [acceptable to] ACCREDITED BY THE COUNCIL ON EDUCATION OF THE AMERICAN PODIATRIC MEDICAL ASSOCIATION AND APPROVED BY the Board.
- (f) The Board may require an applicant to complete [1 year of postgraduate clinical training in] A POSTGRADUATE PODIATRIC RESIDENCY PROGRAM IN:
 - (1) A health care facility licensed or approved by the Department;
- (2) A program approved by the Council on Education of the American Podiatric Medical Association or its successor; or
 - (3) A program approved by the Board.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.
