SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Natural Resources

10-410.

- (e) (2) (i) Except in Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Calvert, Carroll, CHARLES, Allegany, Garrett, Howard, Kent, Caroline, Talbot, Dorchester, Queen Anne's, Cecil, Frederick, St. Mary's, Somerset, Washington, Wicomico, and Worcester Counties, a person may cast the rays of an artificial light from a vehicle on woods, fields, orchards, livestock, wild animals, or wild birds for the sole purpose of observing or photographing wildlife until 9:00 p.m.
- (ii) If a person casts the rays of any artificial light under this paragraph the person has the burden of establishing that the person was doing so for the purposes of observing or photographing wildlife.
- (iii) If a person casting artificial light under this paragraph or anyone with the person casting artificial light has a firearm or bow in the person's possession, the person shall be presumed to be in violation of paragraph (1) of this subsection.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 101

(Senate Bill 199)

AN ACT concerning

Drunk and Drugged Driving - Probation Before Judgment

BCO 3-91

FOR the purpose of providing that a person may not receive probation before judgment for a subsequent drunk or drugged driving conviction that occurs within a certain period after a previous drunk or drugged driving conviction without regard to which of the violations giving rise to the convictions occurred first; and defining a certain term prohibiting a court from placing a person on probation before judgment for certain drunk or drugged driving violations within a certain period of time after the person was convicted of, or placed on probation before judgment for, certain drunk or drugged driving violations; and generally relating to probation before judgment
