- [(7)] (10) Be a part of the well-child clinic delivery system provided by the Baltimore City Health Department.
- (c) (1) Physician consultation and collaboration in medical management of care shall be available at all times onsite or by telephone.
- (2) Other consultant services in the school health program, in the maternal child health program, or in the community health nursing program will be available as needed by the [pediatric-school] nurse practitioner, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, OR OTHER APPROPRIATE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER.

- (a) In Caroline County the [pediatric-school] nurse practitioner, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, OR OTHER APPROPRIATE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER will be assigned, TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, to[:
 - (1) Greensboro Elementary School, Greensboro, Maryland 21639;
 - (2) Ridgely Elementary School, Ridgely, Maryland 21660;
 - (3) Federalsburg Elementary School, Federalsburg, Maryland 21632;
 - (4) Preston Elementary School, Preston, Maryland 21655; and
- (5) Denton Elementary School, Denton, Maryland 21629] ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOLS.
- [(b) Services of this Program shall be available to all school children with priorities in the following areas:
 - (1) In kindergartens;
- (2) In grades 1 through 3 to children who are identified as needing special education; and
- (3) In grades 1 through 3 to new students entering the Caroline County school system.]
- [(c)] (B) The services provided by the [pediatric-school] nurse practitioner, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, OR OTHER APPROPRIATE HEALTH CARE PROVIDER shall, TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, include:
- (1) Assessment of the health status of all targeted students in the selected elementary AND MIDDLE schools including history, physical examination, neuro-developmental evaluation, and all required early and periodic screening, diagnosis, and treatment programs;
- (2) Provision of health care including well-child care and treatment of common injuries and illnesses; and
- (3) Integration of health care with existing health care providers and health education programs directed at students, teachers, and parents.
