

SUBTITLE OR ANY RULE OR REGULATION ADOPTED UNDER THIS PART VII OF THIS SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY IMPOSED IN A CIVIL ACTION NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 FOR EACH VIOLATION.

(B) EACH DAY A VIOLATION OCCURS IS A SEPARATE VIOLATION UNDER THIS SECTION.

(C) THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF CIVIL PENALTIES IMPOSED IN AN ACTION UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT EXCEED \$5,000.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 137

(House Bill 86)

AN ACT concerning

Air Quality Control – Criminal Penalties

FOR the purpose of providing certain criminal penalties for certain knowing violations of the law governing ambient air quality and any rule, regulation, order, approved plan for compliance, approval, or permit adopted under that law; providing certain penalties for knowingly making certain false statements or falsifying or tampering with certain devices or methods; ~~providing that a person may be enjoined from continuing certain violations~~; providing that each day a violation occurs is a separate violation; authorizing the Attorney General to take certain actions; defining a certain term; and generally relating to enforcement of the laws governing air quality control.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
