CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$10,000 FOR EACH DAY OF VIOLATION OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS OR BOTH IF THE PERSON:

- (1) KNOWINGLY MAKES ANY FALSE STATEMENT, REPRESENTATION, OR CERTIFICATION IN ANY APPLICATION, RECORD, REPORT, PLAN, OR OTHER DOCUMENT FILED OR REQUIRED TO BE MAINTAINED UNDER THIS TITLE OR ANY RULE, REGULATION, ORDER, APPROVED PLAN FOR COMPLIANCE, APPROVAL, OR PERMIT ADOPTED OR ISSUED UNDER THIS TITLE; OR
- (2) <u>KNOWINGLY</u> FALSIFIES, TAMPERS WITH, OR KNOWINGLY RENDERS INACCURATE ANY MONITORING DEVICE OR METHODS REQUIRED TO BE MAINTAINED UNDER THIS TITLE OR ANY RULE, REGULATION, ORDER, APPROVED PLAN FOR COMPLIANCE, <u>APPROVAL</u>, OR PERMIT ADOPTED OR ISSUED UNDER THIS TITLE.

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL TAKE CHARGE OF, PROSECUTE, AND DEFEND ON BEHALF OF THIS STATE EVERY CASE ARISING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE, INCLUDING THE RECOVERY OF PENALTIES.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 138

(House Bill 87)

AN ACT concerning

Motor Vehicles - Handicapped-Placard Design Disabled Person's Parking Permits

FOR the purpose of altering the design of a certain placard issued as a disabled person's parking permit; and generally relating to handicapped placard design and placement requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to issue a disabled person's parking permit in a form capable of being hung from a certain rearview mirror under certain circumstances; requiring a certain parking permit to be displayed in a certain manner; providing for certain exceptions; prohibiting a person from driving a vehicle while a certain parking permit is displayed in a certain manner; clarifying language; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the issuance and display of certain disabled person's parking permits.
