AND WITH INTENT TO DECEIVE, MAKE A FALSE STATEMENT TO A PEACE OR POLICE OFFICER CONCERNING THE PERSON'S IDENTITY, ADDRESS, OR DATE OF BIRTH.

(C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be subject to a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or be imprisoned not more than six (6) months, or [be] both [fined and imprisoned, in the discretion of the court].

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

## **CHAPTER 148**

(House Bill 118)

## AN ACT concerning

## Pharmacists - Unauthorized Refills - Declared Emergencies or Disasters

FOR the purpose of authorizing pharmacists, under certain emergency circumstances, to refill a prescription certain prescriptions for which the refill has not been authorized; and generally relating to the unauthorized refilling of prescriptions by pharmacists.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Health Occupations

12-511.

- (a) A pharmacist may refill a prescription for a drug for which the refill has not been authorized if:
  - (1) The pharmacist:
- (i) Attempts to obtain an authorization from the authorized prescriber; and
  - (ii) Is not able readily to obtain the authorization.
