AN ACT concerning

Crimes and Punishments - Anabolic Steroids

FOR the purpose of adding certain anabolic steroids to a certain schedule of controlled dangerous substances; prohibiting a person from distributing, dispensing, administering, or possessing an anabolic steroid <u>under certain circumstances</u>; specifying certain exceptions; defining certain terms; <u>prohibiting a person from distributing or possessing human growth hormones</u>; providing for certain penalties for a violation of this Act; providing that a certain steroid warning notice <u>concerning anabolic steroids</u> and <u>human growth hormone</u> shall be erected by certain facilities under certain guidelines; and generally relating to anabolic steroids.
