- (B) (C) NOTWITHSTANDING THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 217 OF THIS SUBTITLE, UPON A WRITTEN PETITION FOR DISSOLUTION BY ANY MEMBER OF THE MOST RECENTLY ELECTED OR APPOINTED BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF AN ASSOCIATION CONSIDERED CURRENTLY INACTIVE, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY IN WHICH THE ASSOCIATION WAS ORGANIZED SHALL PROMPTLY:
- (1) CONSIDER ALL AVAILABLE INFORMATION TO DETERMINE THE CURRENT OPERATING STATUS AND FORESEEABLE OPERATING POTENTIAL OF THE ASSOCIATION; AND
- (2) BY MAJORITY VOTE, APPROVE OR DENY THE PETITION FOR DISSOLUTION.
- (C) (D) IF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS APPROVES A PETITION FOR DISSOLUTION UNDER THIS SECTION, THE BOARD SHALL:
- (1) WITH ANY BALANCE REMAINING IN THE COUNTY TREASURY TO THE CREDIT OF THE DISSOLVED ASSOCIATION:
- (I) SATISFY ALL OUTSTANDING DEBTS OF THE ASSOCIATION; AND
- (II) DISTRIBUTE ANY REMAINDER TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS; AND
- (2) PROVIDE FOR THE TRANSFER OF ANY INTEREST IN REAL PROPERTY HELD BY THE INACTIVE ASSOCIATION TO THE COUNTY OR COUNTIES IN WHICH THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.
