

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all trusts existing on or after July 1, 1991, regardless of the effective date of the governing instrument under which the trust was created.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

## CHAPTER 171

(House Bill 282)

AN ACT concerning

### Procurement – Purchasing Pools

FOR the purpose of adding public or quasi-public agencies that receive State money and are exempt from taxation under a certain provision of the Internal Revenue Code to the list of entities that are authorized to use the services of the Department of General Services to purchase materials, supplies, and equipment under certain conditions; making technical changes; and generally relating to the purchasing of certain supplies for certain entities by the State.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

#### Article 41 – Governor – Executive and Administrative Departments

18-201.

[The county commissioners or the appropriate purchasing agency for any county, any municipal corporation, the City of Baltimore, and any other governmental agency in this State may utilize the services of the Purchasing Bureau of the Department of General Services to purchase materials, supplies and equipment, subject to the initial approval of the Secretary of General Services.]

(A) SUBJECT TO THE INITIAL APPROVAL OF THE SECRETARY OF GENERAL SERVICES, THE SERVICES OF THE PURCHASING BUREAU OF THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES MAY BE USED TO PURCHASE MATERIALS, SUPPLIES, AND EQUIPMENT BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OR THE APPROPRIATE PURCHASING ENTITY FOR:
