AGENCY AND, AFTER WRITTEN NOTIFICATION OF DENIAL OF APPROVAL, CEASE FUNDING OR REQUEST THE RETURN OF <u>UNSPENT</u> FUNDS BY THE CORE SERVICE AGENCY.

- (F) IF A COUNTY ELECTS TO TERMINATE ITS CORE SERVICE AGENCY, THE COUNTY MAY DO SO UPON 90 DAYS WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE SECRETARY.
- (G) THE SECRETARY MAY NOT REQUIRE A CORE SERVICE AGENCY TO PROVIDE SERVICES THE DEPARTMENT DOES NOT PROVIDE FUNDING FOR.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December 1, 1991 the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall report to the House Environmental Matters Committee of the Maryland General Assembly on:
  - A. The status of core service agencies in the State, including:
    - (i) Which jurisdictions have core service agencies;
    - (ii) The funding for each core service agency in the State; and
    - (iii) The size of the population served by each core service agency;
- B. The procedures established for a process regarding program, policy, or contract disputes;
- <u>C.</u> The procurement process utilized by each core service agency to provide services;
- <u>D.</u> Whether for-profit entities should be allowed to serve as core service agencies; and
- E. Whether there should be qualifications established for directors of core service agencies.
- SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.
