that attorney's firm may not represent a person in any proceeding before or with the agency.

[3-1003.] 3-603. Attorney being a member of agency.

(a) Actions prohibited. An attorney who is a member of any agency or any member of that attorney's firm may not represent a person in any proceeding before or with the agency.

Title 4. Elections and Election Districts

Subtitle 1. Election Districts

4-101. Election districts; number, names, boundaries.

Washington County is divided into [twenty-seven (27)] 27 election districts, according to their present names, bounds and limits, and all elections for public officers shall be held in the [said] districts, at the places [therein heretofore] established by law for that purpose. Subtitle 2. Municipal Referendum Questions.

4-201. Municipal referendum questions.

(a) Municipal referendum questions.

- (1) The Board of Supervisors of Elections of Washington County, with the consent of the County Commissioners, may arrange with the appropriate officials of any municipal corporation or of any special tax area within the county to include municipal or tax area referendum questions on the ballot or voting machine labels being used for any county or State election.
- (2) These questions may then appear on the ballots or voting machine labels so that they may be voted upon only by residents of the particular municipal corporation
