The members of the [board] BOARD shall take and subscribe the oath required by other State officers. They may elect out of their number a President, Secretary, and Treasurer, and adopt the rules and [by-laws] BYLAWS for the transaction of business of the Board that they consider necessary. ### 8-103. Compensation of Board members.

### (a) Compensation.

- (1) Each member of the Board shall receive compensation of \$30 per day subject to a maximum of \$300 per year for actual service in attending meetings of the Board.
- (2) The compensation shall be paid out of any funds in the hand of the Treasurer of the Board.
- (3) The Secretary of the Board may receive additional compensation as the Board considers just and reasonable, subject to the [by-laws] BYLAWS of the Board.
- (b) Source of funds. The compensation and expenses of the Board may not be paid out of the funds in the State Treasury or become a charge against the State. (1957 Code, sec. 210. 1951, ch. 328, sec. 179C; 1955, ch. 229, sec. 179C; 1970 ed. sec. 12–3; 1984, ch. 289; 1986, ch. 586)

### 8-104. Meetings of Board; regulations.

(a) Meetings. The Board shall meet at least quarterly in each year in Hagerstown and shall hold special meetings as frequently as the proper and efficient discharge of its business requires.

# (b) Regulations.

- (1) The Board shall adopt [rules and] regulations for the examinations of Master Electricians and for the placement, installation, and operation of electrical wires, appliances, apparatus, or construction in, [upon] UPON, and about buildings in Washington County.
- (2) When adopted, the [rules and] regulations have the same force and effect as law. The [rules] REGULATIONS of the Board also shall provide for the giving of timely notice of such meetings to all those who have made application for a license. ## 8-105. Master Electrician; definition, license.

(a) Defined. In this subtitle, Master Electrician means and includes any and all individuals engaged in the business of, or holding themselves out to the public as engaged in the business of installing, erecting, or repairing, or contracting to install, erect, or repair electric wires or conductors that are used for the transmission of electric current for electric light, heat, or power purposes, or moldings, ducts, [raceways] RACEWAYS, or conduits for the reception or protection of such wires or conductors, or to any electrical machinery, apparatus, devices, or fixtures to be used for electric light, [heat]
