

(e) Employees. The Commission shall employ an executive director and may employ other employees as its business may require within the limits of its appropriation. (1959, ch. 404, sec. 202D; 1970 ed. sec. 8-35; 1984, ch. 289 and 506; 1988, ch. 45)

9-105. Reports.

(a) Annual reports. The Commission shall file annual reports with the County Commissioners and Mayor and City Council. The reports shall be available to the public.

(b) Recommendations. The annual report shall include subjects and recommendations for the improvement and advancement of the economic welfare of the people of Washington County. (1959, ch. 404, sec. 202E; 1970 ed. sec. 8-36; 1984, ch. 289 and 506; 1988, ch. 45)

9-106. Powers.

The Commission may:

(1) Investigate and assemble information and statistics pertinent to the economic resources and industrial opportunities of the county;

(2) Encourage location of new industrial and business enterprises in the county and the retention and expansion of present enterprises;

(3) Encourage development of recreational areas and encourage tourist business in the county, making the public aware of the county's historical background and progress;

(4) Disseminate information in the interest of industrial and business development by publication, [advertising] ADVERTISING, and other means;

(5) Cooperate with any federal, [state] STATE, local agency, [board] BOARD, or commission, including the Maryland Department of Economic and Employment Development, in the furtherance of its purposes;

(6) Cooperate with any interested private concern, civic [organization] ORGANIZATION, or subdivision thereof in furtherance of its purposes; and

(7) Establish and appoint Advisory Groups and Committees to assist in its program of activity, the membership of which is not restricted to members of the Commission. (1959, ch. 404, sec. 202F; 1970 ed. sec. 8-36; 1984, ch. 289 and 506; 1988, ch. 45)

Title 10. Prohibited Acts

Subtitle 1. Trespass

10-101. Trespass unlawful; penalty.

(a) Trespass unlawful. A person may not go on another person's land to hunt or fish against the will and without the consent of the owner or occupant.

(b) Consent. A person may not go on another person's land and injure or carry
