

department of the County government under the general supervision of the chief administrative officer, and which shall have the powers of a liquor control board as defined in § 163 of this subtitle. Whenever used in this subtitle the words "liquor control board" or "board" shall be construed to apply to the Department of Liquor Control in Montgomery County whenever such construction would be reasonable.

(h) Members of the several boards shall receive compensation as follows:

(1) Garrett County—[\$2,000 per annum, and] THE SALARY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD OF GARRETT COUNTY SHALL BE SET BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 91 OF THE PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS OF GARRETT COUNTY. EACH MEMBER IS ENTITLED TO a mileage fee in amounts equal to the mileage fees provided for in the Standard State Travel Regulations when attending meetings.

Article 10 – Attorneys at Law and Attorneys in Fact

(a) The State's Attorneys in the several counties of the State shall receive annually the respective salaries set forth for performing the duties required of them by their respective public local laws and by the public general laws, and such expenses as are provided by law and by the current practice in the several counties. The State's Attorneys shall receive annual payments for office, traveling and other expenses. All payments for salaries and expenses shall be made by the respective counties in equal monthly installments unless otherwise specified. The salaries and expenses are as follows:

(l) In Garrett County:

(1) The State's Attorney shall devote full time to the duties of office.

(2) The State's Attorney [is entitled to a salary of] SHALL RECEIVE:

(i) \$38,000 for calendar year 1991;

(ii) \$42,000 for calendar year 1992;

(iii) \$46,000 for calendar year 1993; [and]

(iv) \$50,000 for calendar year 1994; and

(V) [for] FOR each subsequent calendar year, THE SALARY SET BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 91 OF THE PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS OF GARRETT COUNTY.

Article 25 – County Commissioners

(a) The county treasurers of the several counties of the State shall receive annually the respective salaries herewith set forth for performing the duties required of them by their respective public local laws and by the public general laws of the State:
