SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the salaries of the Board of Education of Garrett County specified in Chapter 708 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1989 shall remain in effect until the implementation of the procedure set forth in this Act and for the remainder of the members of the Board then current terms.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the salaries of the President and the members of the Board of Supervisors of Elections of Garrett County specified in Chapter 443 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1985 shall remain in effect until the implementation of the procedure set forth in this Act and for the remainder of the President's and members' then current terms.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the salary of the members of the Liquor Control Board of Garrett County specified in Chapter 54 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1981 shall remain in effect until the implementation of the procedure set forth in this Act.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the salaries of the judges of the Orphans' Court for Garrett County specified in Chapter 708 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1989 shall remain in effect until the implementation of the procedure set forth in this Act and for the remainder of the judges of the court then current terms.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, § 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, an ordinance passed by the County Commissioners of Garrett County affecting the salary or compensation of any public officer mentioned in this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to the salary or compensation of the public officer in office on the effective date of the ordinance, unless the term of the public officer is fixed by law to exceed 4 years; but the provisions of the ordinance authorized by this Act concerning the salary or compensation of the public officer affected shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office.

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

(House Bill 653)

AN ACT concerning

Insurance Commissioner - Consumer Education and Advocacy Program

FOR the purpose of altering the purposes of the Consumer Education and Advocacy Program of the Insurance Commissioner to include assisting consumers of health insurance to develop a basis from which to make a selection from various health insurance plans clarify that the information and assistance system for insurance comsumers shall include matters regarding health and life insurance coverages; and
