SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments

- (a) There is a Commission to Save the Lighthouses.
- (f) The Commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, consistent with § 2–1312 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly by July 1, [1991] 1996.
  - (g) Once the Commission issues its report, it [ceases] CONTINUES to exist.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991, contingent on the taking effect of Chapter \_\_\_\_ (S.B. 371) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1991, and if Chapter \_\_\_\_ does not become effective, this Act shall be null and void without the necessity of further action by the General Assembly.
