SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the expiration of the terms of the additional members does not effect affect any action taken by the additional members pursuant to this Act. All unfinished business of the board upon expiration of the terms of the additional members shall revert to the board members appointed under § 3–103(a) of the Tax – Property Article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991 and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after June 30, 1991. Sections 2, 3, and 4 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30, 1993, with no further action required by the General Assembly, Sections 2, 3, and 4 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
