Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Public Education," subtitle "County School Commissioners," and including also all other matters of which the public should be informed, in the discretion of said Board; provided, however, that said Board of County School Commissioners shall not allow, as compensation or consideration for the publications hereinbefore mentioned, more than the current rates charged by said newspapers for such like advertising, and provided, further, that in the event that the publishers or managers of any of said newspapers shall refuse to publish all of the publications as hereinbefore provided upon the terms and for the compensation aforesaid, then and in said event the publication in any of such newspapers, the publishers or managers of which will publish the publications aforesaid upon the terms aforesaid, shall be sufficient publication thereof by said Board].

- A. Composition. The office of Sheriff of Charles County consists of:
- (1) The Sheriff and Deputy Sheriffs as authorized [by Article 87, § 37(h)] UNDER § 2–309 OF THE COURTS AND JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND.
 - (2) The Board of Public Safety.
- (3) [Such other] OTHER employees as are authorized by public general or public local law.
- L. Retirement provisions. The [Board of] County Commissioners may include [all of] the members of the Sheriff's office in the Maryland State Retirement System as provided [by] UNDER Article 73B, §§ [21 to 30,] 163 THROUGH 170 of the Annotated Code of Maryland[, 1957 Edition, as amended from time to time].

- C. Occupancy tax. An occupancy tax shall be paid for each occupied trailer space.
 - (1) The tax shall be [:
 - (a) As of July 1, 1982: five dollars (\$5.) per month.
 - (b) As of July 1, 1983: ten dollars (\$10.) per month.
- (c) As of July 1, 1984, and each year thereafter: fifteen dollars (\$15.)] \$15 per month.
- (2) The occupancy tax shall be prorated for any period of occupancy of less than one [(1)] month.
- (3) If the owner of any trailer subject to the occupancy tax of this subsection is eligible and applies for property tax relief as an elderly or disabled renter pursuant to § 9-102 OF THE TAX PROPERTY Article [81, § 12F-3,] of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the tax shall be [five dollars (\$5.)] \$5 per month.
