(d) (1) For the purpose of establishing and maintaining this Fund, the Commission shall impose an assessment of [\$150] \$2,500 against an uninsured employer as defined in \$ 102 of this article when the Commission renders a decision on a claim for compensation. The Commission shall direct payment of the assessment into the Fund in connection with each such claim when an injury occurred on or after the first day of January, 1968, or in death cases, where death is the result of an injury occurring on or after that date. [The Commission shall also impose an additional assessment of 15 percent of the awards made in each such claim, such additional assessment not to exceed \$1,500 in any one claim, and shall direct that additional assessment also be paid into the Fund.]

Article - Labor and Employment

- (a) When the Commission makes a decision on a claim for compensation against an uninsured employer, the Commission shall impose against the uninsured employer an assessment of:
 - (1) [\$150] \$500; and
 - (1) AT LEAST \$150 BUT NOT EXCEEDING \$500; AND
- (2) 15% of any award made in the claim, not exceeding [\$1,500] \$2,500 in any 1 claim.
