SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Transportation

6–201.

- (d) (1) The Governor may not appoint to the Commission:
 - (i) An officer or employee of the State;
- (ii) A representative of any entity whose principal activities are ports-related;
- (iii) A person employed by any entity whose principal activities are ports-related; or
 - (iv) A member of the General Assembly.
- (2) The Governor shall take into consideration geographic representation when appointing the 6 members of the Commission.
- (3) NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A MEMBER OF THE MARYLAND TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY MAY BE APPOINTED A MEMBER OF THE MARYLAND PORT COMMISSION. ANY PERSON SO APPOINTED IS NOT ENTITLED TO ANY COMPENSATION OR OTHER EMOLUMENT, EXCEPT EXPENSES INCURRED IN CONNECTION WITH ATTENDANCE AT HEARINGS, MEETINGS, FIELD TRIPS, AND WORKING SESSIONS, FOR ANY SERVICES RENDERED AS A COMMISSIONER.

- [(c) Any transfer of the 'McComas Street Terminal to the Administration shall provide that, if the Administration is abolished and its principal functions are not vested in another agency, the McComas Street Terminal shall revert to and become the property of Baltimore City.]
