

(2) AS AN ABSOLUTE LIMIT AGAINST ANY ONE CHILD, THE CHILD'S PARENTS, OR BOTH, AN ORDER OF RESTITUTION ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT EXCEED ~~\$10,000~~ \$5,000 FOR ALL ACTS ARISING OUT OF A SINGLE INCIDENT.

(3) A COURT MAY NOT ISSUE AN ORDER OF RESTITUTION AGAINST A PARENT UNDER THIS SECTION UNLESS THE PARENT HAS BEEN AFFORDED A REASONABLE OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD AND TO PRESENT APPROPRIATE EVIDENCE ON THE PARENT'S BEHALF. A HEARING UNDER THIS SECTION MAY BE HELD AS PART OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEEDING AGAINST THE CHILD.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 308

(Senate Bill 460)

AN ACT concerning

Motor Vehicles -- Tractors -- Registration Plates

FOR the purpose of altering the number of registration plates the Motor Vehicle Administration is required to issue for certain tractor vehicles; and requiring the registration plate of a tractor vehicle to be attached to the front of the vehicle.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article -- Transportation

13-410.

- (a) (1) When it registers a vehicle, the Administration shall issue to the owner:
 - (i) One registration plate, if the vehicle is a Class D (motorcycle) vehicle, CLASS F (TRACTOR) VEHICLE, or [a] Class G (trailer) vehicle; and
 - (ii) Two registration plates for every other vehicle.
