committee shall consider the recommendations of the Governor and advise the Governor as to its decision whether or not to allow the salary to be restored to the full amount as provided in the budget and the amount withheld to be paid.

SECTION 25. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of Budget and Fiscal Planning shall submit to the budget committees a report on executive implementation of legislative position reductions to the FY 1992 budget. This report shall detail by program, title, grade and salary, positions abolished as the result of legislative action on the budget. This report shall be submitted not later than August October 1, 1991.

## SECTION 26. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

(1) The following amounts of fiscal year 1992 general fund appropriations made to the programs listed for the purposes indicated shall be contingent on enactment of legislation that imposes the sales tax on the sale of cigarettes and that repeals for Maryland income tax purposes the subtraction modification for capital gains H.B. 707 and H.B. 1206 as specified in this section:

- (2) In the event that either bill shall fail, each appropriation listed shall be reduced in the same proportion as the revenues to be generated by the failed legislation represented of the total revenues expected from the two bills combined (a) In the event that H.B. 707 fails, each appropriation listed shall be reduced by 50% of the amount listed in subsection (1) of this section; and
- (b) In the event that H.B. 1206 fails, each appropriation listed shall be reduced by 50% of the amount listed in subsection (1) of this section.
- (3) Reductions resulting from operation of this-section shall be allocated among the jurisdictions in proportion to allocations received in the original appropriation.
- (1) \$69,400,000 65,400,000 of funds appropriated in program 36.01.02.01 for Basic Current Expense Aid shall be contingent on enactment of H.B. 707 or S.B 454.
- (2) In the event H.B. 707 and S. B. 454 shall fail, distributions to local jurisdictions under the current expense aid formula shall be reduced as provided under H.B. 206 of the 1991 Acts of the General Assembly.
