(B) The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City may grant, by law, a property tax credit under this section against the county property tax imposed on real property that is leased, occupied, and used only by the Baltimore Association for Retarded Citizens, Incorporated.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 337

(House Bill 49)

AN ACT concerning

Evidence - Battered Spouse Syndrome - Expert Testimony

FOR the purpose of allowing a court to admit evidence of certain abuse of a defendant by an individual who is a spouse, former spouse, cohabitant, or former cohabitant of the defendant and who is a victim of a certain crime for which the defendant has been charged under certain circumstances; providing that specific types of evidence may be admitted as relevant to certain defenses; specifying that a court may admit certain evidence notwithstanding certain other evidence; defining certain terms; and generally relating to battered spouse evidence and expert testimony.
