SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the provisions of Article 73B – Pensions, §§ 11(15)(b), 86(9)(b), 117(14)(b), and 145(13)(b) of the Annotated Code of Maryland do not apply to a beneficiary retired member who, on June 1, 1991, is serving in an elected position as an official of a participating municipal corporation as defined in Article 73B, § 163(d) of the Code or as a constitutional officer for a county that is a participating municipal corporation.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that this Act shall be construed both retroactively and prospectively and shall apply to, and be interpreted to have an effect upon, any beneficiary retired member of the Employees' Retirement System, the Teachers' Retirement System, the Pension System for Employees of the State of Maryland, or the Pension System for Teachers of the State of Maryland who is reemployed in an elected position of a participating municipal corporation or as a constitutional officer for a county that is a participating municipal corporation and who is serving in that position on June 1, 1991.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 341

(House Bill 85)

AN ACT concerning

Child Care - Administrative Search Warrants

FOR the purpose of authorizing a judge to issue an administrative search warrant to the Department of Human Resources to enter certain <u>unregistered or unlicensed</u> child care facilities under certain circumstances; providing for the application of an administrative search warrant; specifying certain information be contained in the application; providing certain circumstances under which the administrative search warrant may be obtained and carried out; authorizing the Department of Human Resources to conduct an inspection of a licensed or an unlicensed child care center and a registered or an unregistered family child day care home; providing for the scope and period of enforceability of the administrative search warrant; <u>defining a term;</u> and generally relating to administrative search warrants for child care facilities.
