

(i) changes in the work, if the changes are within the scope of the procurement contract; and

(ii) a temporary stop or delay in performance;

(4)] variations that occur between estimated and actual quantities of work in a procurement contract;

[(5)] (4) liquidated damages, as appropriate; [and

(6)] (5) specified excuses for nonperformance; AND

(6) EXCEPT FOR REAL PROPERTY LEASES, THE UNILATERAL RIGHT OF THE STATE TO ORDER IN WRITING:

(I) CHANGES IN THE WORK, IF THE CHANGES ARE WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THE PROCUREMENT CONTRACT; AND

(II) A TEMPORARY STOP OR DELAY IN PERFORMANCE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 343

(House Bill 97)

AN ACT concerning

Juvenile Causes – ~~Children In Need of Assistance – Transferring Certain Responsibilities to~~ Responsibilities of the Department of Juvenile Services and Local Departments of Social Services

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Juvenile Services to adopt certain regulations concerning the treatment of juveniles at certain facilities; transferring certain responsibilities for Children In Need of Assistance (CINA) to the local departments of social services; providing that under certain circumstances, responsibility for authorizing CINA petitions be transferred from the Department of Juvenile Services to local departments of social services; altering the circumstances under which certain parties and other persons are required to be informed of certain decisions, and the reasons for the decisions, concerning certain complaints; ~~and~~ providing that responsibility for authorizing emergency shelter care for CINAs be transferred from the Department of Juvenile Services to the local departments of social services; and generally relating to certain responsibilities of the Department of Juvenile Services and local departments of social services regarding certain petitions.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
