SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Transportation

20-102.

- (a) The driver of each vehicle involved in an accident that results in bodily injury to or death of any person immediately shall stop the vehicle as close as possible to the scene of the accident, without obstructing traffic more than necessary.
- (b) The driver of each vehicle involved in an accident that results in bodily injury to or death of any person immediately shall return to and remain at the scene of the accident until he has complied with § 20–104 of this title.

27-101.

- (c) Any person who is convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of the following sections of this article is subject to a fine of not more than \$500 or imprisonment for not more than 2 months or both:
- [(15) $\$ 20-102 ("Driver to remain at scene—Accidents resulting in bodily injury or death");]
- (N) ANY PERSON WHO IS CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF § 20–102 OF THIS ARTICLE ("DRIVER TO REMAIN AT SCENE ACCIDENTS RESULTING IN BODILY INJURY OR DEATH") IS SUBJECT TO:
- (1) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$1,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 1 YEAR OR BOTH;
- (2) FOR A SECOND OFFENSE, A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$2,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 2 YEARS OR BOTH; AND
- (3) FOR A THIRD OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$3,000 OR IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 3 YEARS OR BOTH.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 27–101(c)(16) through (26), respectively, of Article Transportation of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 27–101(c)(15) through (25), respectively.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.
