

(2) A custodian may deny inspection by a person in interest only to the extent that the inspection would:

- (i) interfere with a valid and proper law enforcement proceeding;
- (ii) deprive another person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication;
- (iii) constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (iv) disclose the identity of a confidential source;
- (v) disclose an investigative technique or procedure;
- (vi) prejudice an investigation; or
- (vii) endanger the life or physical safety of an individual.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 379

(House Bill 499)

AN ACT concerning

Surface Mining – Permit Conditions for Dewatering a Pit

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Natural Resources to establish a zone of dewatering influence around certain surface mines under certain conditions; providing for the extent of a zone of dewatering influence; defining certain terms; requiring certain persons who conduct surface mining and reclamation operations in certain areas to take certain actions as a result of declining water levels or surface subsidence of land; providing certain standards for the replacement of certain water supplies; providing for the repair or compensation for certain damaged real or personal property; prohibiting the Department under certain conditions from requiring the replacement of water supplies or the repair of or compensation for certain property damage; establishing a certain administrative appeal procedure; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations; expressing a certain intent and making certain findings relating to karst terrain; and generally relating to permit conditions for dewatering surface mining pits in certain areas of land.
