- (N) (1) IF THE SECRETARY OF STATE DETERMINES THAT A PERSON SUBJECT TO THE DEPOSIT REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION HAS VIOLATED THAT SECTION OR RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (M) OF THIS SECTION, THE SECRETARY MAY REFER THE MATTER TO:
- (I) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR CIVIL ENFORCEMENT; OR
- (II) THE APPROPRIATE STATE'S ATTORNEY FOR CRIMINAL PROSECUTION.
- (2) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY INSTITUTE A CIVIL ACTION FOR:
 - (I) INJUNCTIVE OR OTHER EQUITABLE RELIEF; AND
- (II) IMPOSITION OF A CIVIL PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000.
- (O) (1) EACH PERSON SUBJECT TO THE DEPOSIT REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION SHALL RECORD AND KEEP DETAILED ACCOUNTS OF ALL SALES AND FUNDS RECEIVED.
- (2) SUCH RECORDS AND THOSE OF ANY TRUSTEE APPOINTED BY THE PERSON ARE SUBJECT TO EXAMINATION BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OR HIS DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE AND BY THE STATE'S ATTORNEY FOR THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE PERSON RESIDES OR WHERE THE CEMETERY IS LOCATED.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 387

(House Bill 596)

AN ACT concerning

North Point State Park and Black Marsh Wildland

FOR the purpose of establishing certain State land in Baltimore County as the North Point State Park; designating, holding, and managing the land under this Act as a State park; authorizing the Department of Natural Resources to adopt regulations concerning the North Point State Park; providing for the land designated under this Act to be subject to certain laws; providing that the provisions of this Act prevail over certain other State laws; designating a certain area of land in Baltimore County as the "Black Marsh Wildland"; requiring priority consideration of certain controls
