- (1) except in a case of alleged child abuse OR ALLEGED ABUSE OF A VULNERABLE ADULT, order the alleged abuser to vacate the family home immediately and grant temporary possession of the family home to the petitioner for not more than 30 days;
- (2) in a case of alleged child abuse OR ALLEGED ABUSE OF A VULNERABLE ADULT, order the alleged abuser to vacate the family home immediately and grant temporary possession of the family home to an adult household member for not more than 30 days;
 - (3) award temporary custody of a minor household member;
- (4) direct any or all of the household members to participate in a professionally supervised counseling program; and
 - (5) order any other relief as necessary.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 391

(House Bill 651)

AN ACT concerning

Medical Assistance Program - Managed Care Program - Termination

FOR the purpose of providing that certain regulations adopted by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene that establish a certain managed care program to provide health care to Medical Assistance Program recipients shall be unenforceable after a certain date unless the Department compiles and submits a certain report reports to the Governor and General Assembly by a certain date.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That any regulations adopted by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene that establish a managed care program called "Access to Care" to provide health care to Medical Assistance Program recipients shall be unenforceable after June 30, 1993 beyond the period approved for waiver by the Health Care Financing Administration, unless the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene compiles and submits a report all reports required by the Health Care Financing Administration to the Governor and General Assembly by January 1, 1993 concurrent to the dates required by the Health Care Financing Administration and that demonstrates the reports demonstrate that this managed care program:

(1) has not adversely affected the health care outcomes of Medical Assistance Program-participants; and
