- (A) THERE IS A CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION ADVISORY COUNCIL.
- (B) THE CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION SHALL PROVIDE STAFF SUPPORT AND FACILITIES FOR THE COUNCIL.

- (A) (1) THE COUNCIL CONSISTS OF AT LEAST 21 MEMBERS, BUT NO MORE THAN 25 MEMBERS.
- (2) IN APPOINTING MEMBERS TO THE COUNCIL, THE SECRETARY SHALL, TO THE EXTENT POSSIBLE, APPOINT MEMBERS REPRESENTING GEOGRAPHICALLY DIVERSE JURISDICTIONS ACROSS THE STATE.

- (II) THE CHILD CARE ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES;
- (III) THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILIES;
 - (IV) THE HEAD START PROGRAM;
 - (V) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION;
 - (VI) THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL;
 - (VII) A LOCAL GOVERNMENT;
 - (VIII) A CHILD CARE ADVOCACY ORGANIZATION;
- (IX) AN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL, WHICH MAY INCLUDE A RELIGIOUS, NONSECTARIAN, OR NURSERY SCHOOL;
 - (X) A CHILD CARE RESOURCE AND REFERRAL AGENCY;
 - (XI) THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT; AND
- (XII) A COMMUNITY COLLEGE WITH AN EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION PROGRAM; AND
