(xxv) Kiribati;

(xxvi) Tuvalu; or

(xxvii) Nauru; or

- (2) one of the following Asian subcontinent countries:
  - (i) India;
  - (ii) Pakistan;
  - (iii) Bangladesh;
  - (iv) Sri Lanka;
  - (v) Bhutan;
  - (vi) The Maldive Islands; or
  - (vii) Nepal.
- (b) The General Assembly requests the Governor to establish an Office on Asian-Pacific American Affairs in the Executive Department.
- (c) Subject to the limitations of any law that governs the activities of other units of the Executive Branch of the State government, the Office shall:
  - (1) advise the Governor on:
- the social and economic development of Asian-Pacific Americans; and
- (ii) any other matter that affects the rights and interests of Asian-Pacific Americans and the communities in which they live;
  - (2) as authorized by the Governor:
- which they live; (1) provide help to Asian-Pacific Americans and the communities in
- (ii) represent the Governor in any matter that relates to Asian-Pacific Americans or generally to the promotion of equality among the people of the State; and
  - (iii) perform any other responsibility that the Governor assigns; and
- (3) assist and advise the Governor and executive agencies concerning public and private programs or efforts to assist or develop Asian-Pacific American businesses.
- (d) The Governor is requested to report to the Legislative Policy Committee of the General Assembly on the establishment of an Office of Asian-Pacific American Affairs prior to the beginning of the 1992 Regular Session.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.
