

(C) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "INTENSIVE CARE POLICY" MEANS A HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY THAT PROVIDES BENEFITS ONLY WHEN TREATMENT IS RECEIVED IN THAT SPECIFICALLY DESIGNATED FACILITY OF A HOSPITAL THAT PROVIDES THE HIGHEST LEVEL OF CARE AND WHICH IS RESTRICTED TO THOSE PATIENTS WHO ARE PHYSICALLY, CRITICALLY ILL OR INJURED.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 419

(House Bill 931)

AN ACT concerning

Hazardous Materials – Expense of Emergency Response, Containment, Cleanup, and Abatement

FOR the purpose of authorizing certain incident commanders at the scene of certain traffic accidents involving hazardous materials to request certain persons for assistance; providing for the ~~submission of a bill to certain motor carriers for certain services under this Act; and requiring certain motor carriers to be responsible for reimbursement of certain costs from the State Hazardous Substance Control Fund under certain circumstances; requiring reimbursement to the Fund by certain persons in accordance with certain provisions; and generally relating to the payment of certain expenses associated with the emergency response, containment, cleanup, and abatement of spills of hazardous materials in a traffic accident.~~
