- (B) A PHYSICIAN WHO VOLUNTARILY AND WITHOUT COMPENSATION RENDERS SERVICES AS A PHYSICIAN FOR A SPORTS PROGRAM, WHETHER OR NOT THE SERVICES ARE RENDERED AT THE REQUEST OF THE SCHOOL'S OR INSTITUTION'S ADMINISTRATION OR A COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION, IS NOT LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGES FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION RESULTING FROM THE RENDERING OF THE SERVICES UNLESS THE ACT OR OMISSION CONSTITUTES:
 - (1) WILLFUL OR WANTON MISCONDUCT:
 - (2) GROSS NEGLIGENCE; OR
 - (3) INTENTIONALLY TORTIOUS CONDUCT.
 - (C) THIS SECTION SHALL APPLY ONLY TO:
 - (1) TREATMENT AT THE SITE OF THE SPORTS PROGRAM;
- (2) TREATMENT AT ANY PRACTICE OR TRAINING FOR THE SPORTS PROGRAM; AND
- (3) TREATMENT ADMINISTERED DURING TRANSPORTATION TO OR FROM THE SPORTS PROGRAM, PRACTICE, OR TRAINING.
- (D) THIS SECTION DOES NOT AFFECT, AND MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED AS AFFECTING, ANY IMMUNITIES FROM CIVIL LIABILITY OR DEFENSES ESTABLISHED BY ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THE CODE OR BY COMMON LAW TO WHICH A VOLUNTEER OR PHYSICIAN MAY BE ENTITLED.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 430

(House Bill 1093)

AN ACT concerning

Commemorative and Organizational Plates <u>Vehicle Laws - Commemorative Plates and</u> Personalized Registration Numbers

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Motor Vehicle Administration to issue certain special commemorative license plates to certain vehicles; <u>authorizing the owner of a Class G nonfreight trailer to apply to the Administration for a personalized registration number; increasing the portion of a certain fee that the Administration is permitted to keep to recover the administrative and production costs of issuing personalized registration plates; and generally relating to special commemorative and organizational plates plates and special, personalized registration numbers.</u>
