- (3) Establish priorities of the different services needed; AND
- (4) Set standards for providing quality precare, care, and aftercare services;
- (5) (4) Include any other matter that the Secretary thinks should be covered.

- (A) BY OCTOBER 1, 1991 JANUARY 1, 1992, WITHIN EXISTING RESOURCES, THE DIRECTOR SHALL PREPARE A NEW UPDATE THE CURRENT MENTAL HYGIENE ADMINISTRATION 3-YEAR PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP PLAN FOR MENTAL HEALTH, WHICH WAS SUBMITTED TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IN RESPONSE TO SECTION 1925 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES ACT, IN ORDER TO PLAN FOR THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO:
- (1) HAVE A SERIOUS MENTAL DISORDER AS DEFINED IN THE PLAN; AND
- (2) DID NOT RECEIVE THE ARE NOT RECEIVING THE APPROPRIATE ARRAY OF COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES DESCRIBED IN THE "TOTAL NEED" SECTION OF THE 3-YEAR MENTAL HEALTH PLAN THAT EXPIRED ON JUNE 30, 1991.
- (B) (1) BY OCTOBER 1, 1993, WITHIN EXISTING RESOURCES <u>AND IN</u> CONCERT WITH LOCAL CORE SERVICE AGENCIES, THE DIRECTOR SHALL PREPARE A COMPREHENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH PLAN TO MEET, BY THE YEAR 2000, WHICH IDENTIFIES THE NEEDS OF ALL INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE A <u>SERIOUS</u> MENTAL DISORDER AND WHO ARE TARGETED FOR SERVICES IN THE "COMPREHENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PLAN" SUBMITTED BY THE STATE TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH <u>PL 99 660</u> SECTION 1925 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES ACT.
 - (2) THE COMPREHENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH PLAN SHALL:
- (I) INCLUDE ANNUAL STRATEGIC PROJECTIONS, THROUGH THE YEAR 2000, OF RESOURCES NEEDED;
- (1) (II) PLAN FOR THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE A SERIOUS MENTAL DISORDER AND, INCLUDING THOSE WHO ARE PRESENTLY NOT BEING SERVED BY THE PUBLIC MENTAL HEALTH SYSTEM, INCLUDING THOSE WHO ARE HOMELESS, AND THOSE CHILDREN, ADULTS, AND ELDERLY INDIVIDUALS LIVING WITHOUT SERVICES IN THE COMMUNITY WITH THEIR FAMILIES OR ON THEIR OWN WHO ARE AT RISK OF FURTHER INSTITUTIONALIZATION;
