

(5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, The Johns Hopkins Health System Corporation shall provide at least an equal and matching fund of \$1,500,000. No part of an applicant's matching fund may be provided, either directly or indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part of the fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the Board of Public Works shall determine the matter, and the Board's decision is final. The Johns Hopkins Health System Corporation has until June 1, [1990] 1993, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that the matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact to the State Treasurer and the proceeds of the loan shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. If this evidence is not presented by June 1, [1990] 1993, the proceeds of the loan shall be applied to the purposes authorized in § 8-129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1991.

CHAPTER 452

(House Bill 1314)

AN ACT concerning

Baltimore County – Towson Town Center – Old Towson Shopping District – Alcoholic Beverages Licenses

FOR the purpose of creating a Class B (TTC) restaurant beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) license for license conversion purposes within a certain designated area in Baltimore County; providing for the number of Class B (TTC) licenses available for license conversion purposes; establishing the requirements, qualifications, fee, and days and hours of sale under this license; permitting in Baltimore County the transfer of a certain number of certain alcoholic beverages licenses across election district lines into a certain area within the County under certain circumstances; providing for the conversion of certain alcoholic beverages licenses to Class B (TTC) licenses; providing certain license transfer prohibitions; providing that the license transfer and conversion provisions of this Act cease after a certain date; and generally relating to the transfer and conversion of and requirements for certain alcoholic beverages licenses within a certain area of the "Towson Town Center" in Baltimore County.
