

(1) FROM FUNDS OF ANY UNIT THAT EMPLOYS THE EMPLOYEE OR BENEFITS FROM THE INNOVATIVE IDEA; OR

(2) AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 1994, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

CHAPTER 460

(House Bill 1149)

AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws – Size, Weight, and Safety

FOR the purpose of altering a certain requirement for a certain registration; changing an allowable size of certain vehicles; eliminating a certain requirement for certain vehicles; permitting certain vehicles meeting certain standards to continue to operate on certain roads; prohibiting certain tolerances from being applied on certain highways; ~~repealing certain exemptions from certain safety standards~~ providing that certain provisions of law do not limit regulation of drivers of vehicles carrying a certain number of passengers; removing sunset provisions; making it lawful for certain vehicles to continue to use certain highways until a certain date under certain circumstances; providing for the various effective dates of this Act; and generally relating to vehicle registration, safety, size, and weight.
