- (b) (2) Any reduction in a county's or Baltimore City's State share of basic current expenses shall be equal to the county's or Baltimore City's proportion of the full time equivalent enrollment in the State times the total amount of the reduction to basic current expense aid resulting from the provisions of Section 26 of House Bill 650 (the fiscal year 1992 budget bill).
- (3) State contributions for social security as provided under § 5-202(d) and § 23-403(c) of the Education Article may be reduced as provided for in other sections of this Act.
- (2) (a) State contributions for social security as provided under § 5 202(d) and § 23 403(e) of the Education Article may be reduced by up to \$7 million in accordance with the provisions of Section 26 of House Bill 650 (the fiscal year 1992 budget bill) relating to Aid for Local Employees Benefits.
- (b) Any reduction in a county's or Baltimore City's share of the State contributions for social security shall be equal to the county's or Baltimore City's proportion of the total fiscal year 1991 State contribution for social security times the total amount of the reduction to Aid for Local Employees Benefits resulting from the provisions of Section 26 of House Bill 650 (the fiscal year 1992 budget bill).
- SECTION 12: 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding any other provision of State law, for fiscal year 1993 only, a Board of Education, Board of Community College Trustees, or Board of Library Trustees shall pay as provided in this section a share of the amounts paid by the State to the Teacher's Retirement System and the Pension System for Teachers for members of these systems whose compensation is paid by a Board of Education, Board of Community College Trustees, or Board of Library Trustees:
- (1) The State Retirement Agency shall bill each board for any amounts that are attributable to increases in a board's fiscal year 1992 payroll over the fiscal year 1991 payroll for members of the teachers' systems, except for those increases in the payroll resulting from net additional positions and any performance, longevity, or individual salary increase for a member.
- (2) In determining a board's fiscal year 1991 payroll for members of the teachers' systems, an adjustment shall be made to annualize a general salary increase that took effect during the fiscal year or to annualize teaching positions added during the fiscal year due to unanticipated increases in enrollment.
- SECTION 13: 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding any other provision of law and for fiscal year 1992 only, the Governor may transfer up to \$3,000,000 in general funds from budget program 36.01.02.03 to budget program 36.01.01.01 by approved budget amendment for criterion reference test development, management information system development, and regional training centers under a Schools for Success program.
- SECTION 14: 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding any other provision of law and for fiscal year 1992 only, after payment of audit expenses, recoveries from units of local government resulting from audits of payments for local employee fringe benefits initiated in fiscal year 1991 or 1992 shall be retained as a special fund from which up
