SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Natural Resources

8-1601.

- (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (4) (I) "Baltimore Harbor" means the waterway which consists of the tidal portions of Patapsco River and its tributaries lying westward of a line extending from Rock Point in Anne Arundel County to North Point in Baltimore County.
- (II) "BALTIMORE HARBOR" INCLUDES THE APPROACH CHANNELS TO THE PORT OF BALTIMORE LYING NORTH OF A LINE EXTENDING FROM SANDY POINT IN ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY TO WILSON POINT IN KENT COUNTY.
 - (6) "DEEP TROUGH" MEANS ANY REGION THAT:
- (I) <u>IS SOUTH OF THE CHESAPEAKE BAY BRIDGE AND NORTH OF A LINE EXTENDING WESTERLY FROM BLOODY POINT; AND </u>
 - (II) HAS A DEPTH THAT EXCEEDS 60 FEET.
