- (i) a required program of at least 1,200 hours of training in a barber school THAT IS [that holds a school permit] APPROVED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION OR THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE BOARD; or
- (ii) an apprenticeship of at least 2,250 hours within 2 years in a barbershop that holds a barbershop permit under the supervision of a master barber.
- (2) If the applicant for a journey barber license is an individual trained and currently licensed as a cosmetologist in the State, the Board shall:
- (i) credit the applicant with having met one half of the training requirement of paragraph (1) of this subsection; and
 - (ii) determine the manner in which the credit will be applied.
- (c) An applicant for a master barber license shall have at least 15 months of experience as a journey barber.
 - (d) [An applicant for an assistant-barber license shall be at least 16 years old.

 - (b) An applicant for an assistant barber teacher license shall:
 - (1) be of good character and reputation;
 - (2) be a high school graduate or the equivalent; and
 - (3) have been licensed as a master barber for at least 2 years.
