CHAPTER 481

(Senate Bill 182)

AN ACT concerning

Cosmetologists

FOR the purpose of continuing the State Board of Cosmetologists (Board) in accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act by extending to a certain date the termination provision relating to the statutory and regulatory authority of the Board and the regulation of cosmetologists; requiring the Department of Fiscal Services to prepare a certain report and submit the report to certain standing committees of the General Assembly by a certain date; eliminating certain licenses; altering certain requirements for certain licenses; establishing a senior cosmetologist license; increasing certain fees; establishing certain fees; establishing a certain-limited license; eliminating or altering certain requirements for certain licenses; eliminating certain registration requirements; eliminating certain statutorily established fees; requiring the Board to establish certain fees; specifying that certain fees established by the Board are set in a certain manner; specifying that the total cost of regulating the cosmetology industry in the State may not be more than certain revenues generated; eliminating certain permit and other requirements for certain cosmetology schools; specifying that the Board may adopt regulations to ensure that cosmetology schools are operated in a sanitary manner; specifying certain procedures that the Board must follow in the filing of certain complaints; specifying that the Board or an inspector may enter and inspect cosmetology schools under certain conditions to determine the sanitary condition of the cosmetology school; altering certain penalties; eliminating certain provisions relating to misrepresentation to the public; authorizing certain individuals with certain credentials to take certain examinations under certain circumstances; eliminating a requirement for a certain medical certification; authorizing the Secretary of the Department of Licensing and Regulation to stagger the expiration and renewal of certain licenses; altering a certain ground for disciplinary action; repealing a prohibition against the operation of certain schools on a certain day; authorizing certain persons to practice in specified locations under certain circumstances; prohibiting a beauty salon permit holder or a limited practice beauty salon permit holder from leasing, subleasing, or otherwise providing certain space on the permitted premises to certain persons; increasing certain penalties; requiring the Board to use certain criteria when it determines the amount of certain penalties: making certain technical changes; prohibiting the Board from taking formal action without the approval of a majority of those eligible to vote; requiring the Executive Director of the Board to be a licensed senior cosmetologist or a master barber; adding a
