- (ii) teach-cosmetology to that other individual; or
- (iii) [manage] SUPERVISE that other individual in the practice of cosmetology.
- (c) An individual may not practice cosmetology, teach cosmetology, or [manage] SUPERVISE a beauty salon in a careless or negligent manner so as to:
 - (1) cause an infection; or
- (2) impart an infectious or contagious disease that presents a hazard to a beauty salon patron.

- [(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a] A person who violates any provision of this title is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$100] \$500.
- [(b) A-person who violates § 5 609(c) of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$500 or imprisonment not exceeding 6 months or both.]

Subject to the evaluation and reestablishment provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act, this title and all regulations adopted under this title shall terminate and be of no effect after July 1, [1991] 2001.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991. 5-101.

- (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (b) "Apprentice" means an individual who, under the supervision of a licensed SENIOR cosmetologist or a holder of a limited license, is learning to practice cosmetology or any limited practice of cosmetology in a beauty salon that holds a beauty salon permit.
- (c) (1) "Beauty salon" means any commercial establishment, except a barbershop, in which an individual practices cosmetology.
- (2) "Beauty salon" does not include a clinic in a cosmetology school [that holds a school permit].
- (d) [(1)] "Beauty salon permit" means a permit issued by the Board to operate a beauty salon.
 - [(2) "Beauty salon permit" includes an owner-manager permit.]
 - (e) "Board" means the State Board of Cosmetologists.
 - (f) "Cosmetologist" means an individual who practices cosmetology.
