(II) THE MERE SHAMPOOING OF HAIR.

- [(1)] (K)(L) "Provide [demonstrating] MAKEUP ARTIST services" means to [demonstrate] APPLY CREAMS, LOTIONS, COSMETIC PREPARATIONS, AND CLEANSING SOLUTIONS to an [individual,] INDIVIDUAL'S FACE for compensation[, any beauty preparation or beauty equipment].
- [(m)] (L)(M) "Provide esthetic services" means to provide to an individual, for compensation, the service of:
- (1) cleansing, exercising, massaging, stimulating, or performing any other similar procedure on the arms, face, hands, or scalp by electrical, mechanical, or any other means;
- (2) applying to the face an [antiseptic] ALCOHOL, cream, lotion, [tonic] ASTRINGENT, or cosmetic preparation; or
 - (3) removing superfluous hair by the use of a depilatory, tweezers, or wax.
- [(n)] (N) "Provide manicuring services" means to manicure or pedicure for compensation the nails of an individual.
- [(o) "Provide wig styling services" means to comb, cut, fit, set, style, or treat for compensation a wig, wiglet, fall, or similar hairpiece of an individual.
 - (p) "School permit" means a permit issued by the Board to operate:
 - (1) a school of cosmetology; or
 - (2) a postgraduate school of cosmetology.

- (a) (1) The Board consists of 5 members.
 - (2) Of the 5 members of the Board:
 - (i) 3 shall be licensed cosmetologists; and
 - (ii) 2 shall be consumer members.
- (3) The Governor shall appoint the members with the advice of the Secretary.
 - (b) Each cosmetologist member of the Board:
- (1) shall have practiced cosmetology actively for at least 5 years before appointment;
 - (2) shall be a citizen of the State;
 - (3) may not be affiliated directly or indirectly with any cosmetology school;
- (4) may not be affiliated with any person who manufactures or sells any article, supply, or merchandise that is commonly used in a beauty salon; and
