

3-214. POSTING NOTICE OF SUBTITLE.

EACH EMPLOYER SHALL KEEP POSTED CONSPICUOUSLY IN EACH PLACE WHERE A MINOR IS EMPLOYED A PRINTED NOTICE OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE, IN A FORM THAT THE COMMISSIONER REQUIRES.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 100, § 13.

The former words "permitted or suffered to work" are deleted as unnecessary in light of the definition of "employ".

3-215. REVOCATIONS.

AFTER REVIEW, THE COMMISSIONER MAY REVOKE A WORK PERMIT OR SPECIAL PERMIT IF THE PERMIT IS NOT ISSUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE COMMISSIONER.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from the third sentence of former Art. 100, § 8(b).

The reference to a "special permit" is added to state expressly that those types of permits may be revoked. Although the balance of former Art. 100, § 8 dealt only with work permits and, thus, the third sentence of former § 8(b) arguably applied only to work permits, it did not seem to be the intent of the General Assembly to preclude revocation of an improperly issued special permit.

The reference to issuance "in accordance with the requirements of the Commissioner" is added to state expressly the ground for revocation.

3-216. PROHIBITED ACTS; PENALTIES.

(A). INTERFERENCE.

A PERSON MAY NOT:

(1) INTERFERE WITH OR HINDER THE PERFORMANCE OF ANY DUTY OF THE COMMISSIONER UNDER THIS SUBTITLE; OR

(2) KNOWINGLY GIVE FALSE INFORMATION TO THE COMMISSIONER.

(B) UNLAWFUL EMPLOYMENT.

A PERSON MAY NOT KNOWINGLY:

(1) EMPLOY A MINOR IN VIOLATION OF A PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE; OR
