- (3) The name of each official or employee, or member of [his] THE immediate family OF AN OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE, who has benefited from [gifts with a cumulative value of \$75 or more during the reporting period] MEALS, BEVERAGES, OR OTHER GIFTS given by the registrant or anyone acting in behalf of the registrant DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD, whether or not the MEALS, BEVERAGES, OR OTHER gifts were given in connection with the registrant's lobbying activities. [For the purpose of this subsection, gifts totaling less than \$15 \$10 in a calendar day need not be counted DISCLOSED. [toward the cumulative value of \$75, but if the cumulative value of \$75 is attained or exceeded, each gift of \$10 or more thereafter shall be itemized by date, beneficiary, amount or value, and nature of the gift.] Expenses reported in paragraph (2)(vii) and (viii) of this subsection above need not be allocated to individual officials or employees, but for each such event, the date, location, and total expense incurred by the registrant shall be stated.
- (b) The Commission may require any registrant to file additional reports as it may deem necessary.
- (e) (1) In addition to any other report required under this section, a registrant, other than an individual, organized and operated for the primary purpose of attempting to influence any legislative or executive action shall report the name and permanent address of each person who provides at least 5 percent of the registrant's total receipts during the preceding 12 months.
- (2) For the purpose of the reporting and registration requirements of this title, receipts of lobbying entities primarily organized and operated for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or executive action include any funds spent on behalf, at the direction, or in the name of the lobbying entity.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Commission shall adopt guidelines governing the implementation of the lobbyist reporting requirements specified under Section 5 105(a)(3) of this Act. Prior to their final adoption and implementation, the proposed guidelines shall be submitted to the Legislative Policy Committee of the General Assembly for review.

SECTION 2. 3. 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.
