- (d) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the law enforcement personnel of the Maryland Alcohol and Tobacco Tax Enforcement Unit.
- (3) A law enforcement employee of the Maryland State Police holding a noncommissioned rank or a Natural Resources police officer of the rank of sergeant or below who appears in court on official duty on a regularly scheduled off-duty day or during a regularly scheduled on-duty day after going off duty shall be compensated at one and one-half times the employee's regular hourly rate. This payment shall be made for not less than [2] 4 2 hours [time on any day the employee is called out].
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that the minimum 4-hour 2-hour overtime payment established in this Act shall apply when an officer is scheduled to appear in court on official duty, as long as the court appearance is on a regularly scheduled off-duty day or during a regularly scheduled on-duty day after the officer goes off duty. However, this Act does not affect the 4-hour minimum overtime payment received when an off-duty officer is needed in court in an emergency situation or when there is no advance notice, as set forth in Article 89. § 76(d)(2) 27(d)(2) of the Code.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.
