altering certain provisions for storing certain tires; repealing the a certain provision requiring a person to dispose of used scrap tires in certain refuse disposal systems under certain circumstances; requiring the Maryland Environmental Service to establish certain used scrap tire recycling systems by certain dates in certain counties; requiring certain facilities established as part of certain tire recycling systems to meet certain zoning and, land use, and certain county solid waste plan requirements; authorizing certain systems to be publicly or privately owned and operated: requiring the Maryland Environmental Service to implement the system by a certain date in certain counties; providing for payment of costs of the system certain systems; prohibiting the disposal of used scrap tires at certain locations after a certain date; and providing a certain exception under certain circumstances; establishing certain requirements for the licensure, registration, and operation of certain tire wholesalers recyclers, haulers, and collection facilities beginning with a certain date; requiring tire dealers to pay a certain fee that may not exceed a certain amount; requiring tire wholesalers to pay a certain fee that may not exceed a certain amount: requiring certain fees to be credited to a certain fund; requiring certain reporting and the confidentiality of reports; expanding the source of funds for the Used Tire Cleanup and Recycling Fund; altering the use of the Fund; requiring the Department to submit a certain report on the status of and use of moneys from the Fund; limiting the Fund to a certain amount; imposing a certain recycling fee on the sale of certain tires and providing a certain exception; prohibiting the imposition of a certain fee in excess of a certain amount and requiring that the fee be established by regulation on consultation with certain persons the Board of Public Works; providing for the itemization of recycling fees charged on certain retail sales; providing for the eollection payment and disposition of certain fees; requiring certain returns to be submitted with the payment of certain fees; providing for a certain credit; prohibiting the taxing of certain recycling fees under certain conditions; providing for administration of the tire recycling fee by the Comptroller; authorizing the Comptroller to adopt certain regulations; providing that certain provisions of law applicable to the sales and use tax shall govern the administration, collection, and enforcement of the tire recycling fee; authorizing the Department of the Environment to require the delivery of certain tires to certain locations and prohibiting certain transfers of tires; prohibiting incineration of tires except in certain facilities; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations by a certain date; defining certain terms; requiring the Department to submit certain reports to the General Assembly; and generally relating to the management and recycling of used scrap tires.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
