- (I) "SCRAP TIRE RECYCLER" MEANS A PERSON WHO IS APPROVED AND LICENSED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO PROCESS SCRAP TIRES TO A FORM OF RAW MATERIALS OR PRODUCTS THAT MAY BE RETURNED TO THE MARKETPLACE.
- $\frac{(F)}{(J)}$  "SERVICE" MEANS THE MARYLAND ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE.
  - [(e)] (G) (K) "Sewage" means:
    - (1) Any human or animal excretion or water-carried domestic waste; or
- (2) A mixture of industrial waste and any of the things in item (1) of this subsection.
- [(f)] (H) (L) "Sewage sludge" means any thickened liquid, suspension, settled solid, or dried residue that a sewage treatment plant extracts from sewage.
- [(g)]  $\overline{\text{(M)}}$  (1) "Sewage sludge generator" means a person who owns or operates a facility that receives and processes sewage in this State or produces sewage sludge to be utilized in this State.
  - (2) "Sewage sludge generator" includes:
    - (i) The Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission; and
    - (ii) The Maryland Environmental Service.
- (3) "Sewage sludge generator" does not include the owner or operator of a septic system.
- [(h)] (J) (N) "Sewage sludge utilization permit" means a permit, issued by the Department, to utilize sewage sludge.
- [(i)] (K) (O) (1) "Sewage sludge utilizer" means a person who utilizes sewage sludge in this State.
  - (2) "Sewage sludge utilizer" includes:
    - (i) The Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission; and
    - (ii) The Maryland Environmental Service.
  - [(j)] (L) (P) (1) "Sewerage system" means:
- (i) The channels used or intended to be used to collect and dispose of sewage; and
- (ii) Any structure or appurtenance used or intended to be used to collect or prepare sewage for discharge into the waters of this State.
  - (2) "Sewerage system" includes any sewer of any size.
