facilities that have been found to have deficiencies, including payment for the costs of relocation of residents to other facilities, maintenance or operation of a nursing facility pending correction of deficiencies or closure, and reimbursement of residents for personal funds lost.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 19-1410 of the Health-General Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland be repealed.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Secretary shall adopt regulations implementing the changes to this subtitle by October 1, 1991.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1991.

## Vending Programs for the Blind

FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Vending Facilities Program for the Blind in the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation; granting a priority on the operation of to the Program to operate vending facilities on certain property in the State to blind persons licensed by the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation; exempting certain property from the requirements of this Act; specifying the distribution of certain vending machine income to certain persons under certain circumstances; and authorizing requiring the Division and the Department of General Services to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; and generally relating to vending programs for the blind.
