- (4) A member of the police department, bureau, or force of any incorporated city or town, except Baltimore City, which is a "qualifying municipality," as defined in § 66(a)(7) and § 69 of Article 88B of this Code;
- (5) A member of the State Aviation Administration police force, or the Mass Transit Administration police force, or the Maryland Port Administration police force of the Department of Transportation or the toll facilities police force of the Maryland Transportation Authority;
- (6) A member of the University of Maryland or Morgan State University police force;
- (7) Appointed, or given the powers of, a special policeman employed and compensated by the State for the enforcement of law and the maintenance of order on property of the State or of any of its agencies, or for the protection of such property; a member of the Department of General Services security force;
- (8) The sheriff of any county or of Baltimore City and whose usual duties include the making of arrests;
- (9) A regularly employed deputy sheriff of any county and who is compensated by the county and whose usual duties include the making of arrests;
- (10) A member of the Natural Resources police of the Department of Natural Resources;
- (11) A member of the Maryland Alcohol and Tobacco Tax Enforcement Unit; [or]
- (12) A member of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission Park Police; OR
  - (13) HOUSING AUTHORITY OF BALTIMORE CITY POLICE FORCE.
- (h) (1) A federal law enforcement officer who, in his official capacity, is authorized by law to make arrests, has the powers of arrest set forth in this section, if the officer is rendering assistance to a police officer as defined in subsection (g), at the request of the police officer or in an emergency.
- (2) A federal law enforcement officer exercising the power of arrest under this section shall have the immunity from liability described under § 5–327 of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article.
- (i) (1) The State Fire Marshal or a full-time assistant of the office of the State Fire Marshal has the same powers of arrest set forth in subsection (c) as to offenses listed under §§ 6, 7, 119, and 139B of this article.
- (2) The State Fire Marshal or a full-time assistant of the office of the State Fire Marshal has the same powers of arrest set forth in subsection (e) as to offenses listed under §§ 8, 9, 9A, 10, 10A, 11, 11D, 111B, 139A, 151C, and 156 of this article.
