

Article – State Finance and ProcurementSection 7-237(d)(2)Annotated Code of Maryland(1988 Replacement Volume and 1990 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 27 – Crimes and Punishments

9.

Any person who wilfully and with intent to injure or defraud the insurer sets fire to or burns or causes to be burned or who aids, counsels or procures the burning of any goods, wares, merchandise or other chattels or personal property of any kind, whether the property of himself or of another, which shall at the time be insured by any person or corporation against loss or damage by fire, shall upon conviction thereof be sentenced to the penitentiary for not more than five (5) years.

11.

Any person, who, while perpetrating, or attempting to perpetrate, a crime, shall set fire to or burn any of the buildings enumerated in this subtitle, shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to the penitentiary for not more than three years.

12B.

(b) Any person who has been admitted to bail or released on recognizance in any criminal case in this State who forfeits the bail or recognizance and willfully fails to surrender himself within thirty days following the date of forfeiture shall be sentenced as provided herein. If the bail or recognizance was given in connection with a charge of felony or pending an appeal, certiorari, habeas corpus, or post conviction proceeding after conviction of any offense, the person shall be fined not more than \$5,000 or imprisoned in the penitentiary for not more than five years or both. If the bail or recognizance was given in connection with a charge of committing a misdemeanor, or for appearance as a witness, the person shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both.

If any person shall bribe or attempt to bribe any executive officer of the State of Maryland, any judge, or other judicial officer of this State, any member or officer of the General Assembly of Maryland, any officer or employee of the State, or of any bi-county or multi-county agency in the State, or of any county, municipality or other political subdivision of the State, including members of the police force of Baltimore City and the State Police or any member or officer of any municipal corporation of this State, or any executive officer of such corporation, in order to influence any such officer or person in the performance of any of his official duties; and if the Governor or other executive officer of this State, any judge, or other judicial officer of this State, any member of the General Assembly of Maryland or officer thereof, any officer or any employee of the State, or of any bi-county or multi-county agency in the State, or of any county, municipality or other political subdivision of the State, including
